

This second edition will feature full color photos throughout, and will retail at a price TBD once we get closer to production. There are 100+ routes on 50+ peaks and zones ranging from Frisco south to almost Buena Vista, with easy access routes winter and spring for Frisco, Copper Mountain, Breckenridge, Leadville, Alma and Fairplay. There have been some access changes since the first edition and those will all be covered. There are many routes suitable for winter turns, along with the classic spring ski mountaineering lines. We're still doing photo, writing and layout work as we speak so a final count on photos is still to be determined, but there will be well over 400 full color photos for sure. Press date is set for October 2023. Print run for this second edition will be 3000 copies.



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

Of all the lines I skied in Tenmile Canyon, for research and the search for the ultimate turn, this was my favorite. It can also be the most serious. If you get slid on the Flying Ridge section you will most likely perish as the lower section ends in a cliff out, this after





48 **MOUNT SHERMAN - 14,036**'

Many consider Sherman to be the easiest fourteener. This is probably true, when going at it via the standard Southeast Slopes. The East Chutes and the West Face offer more interesting alternatives for those seeking something more challenging than the easiest way. You can check out those other lines in *MakingTurns in the Tenmile Mosquito Range*. The mountain is named for Civil War General William Tecumseh Sherman.

Can there be such a thing as an elusive classic? It would entail a line with perfect angle, a little spice to help keep the focus, a beautiful setting and finicky snow. The windward aspect of Mount Sherman is just such a place. The 1,600' West Face beckons the skier; it taunts from the highway and town; multiple chutes grace the wide face, a cliff band runs across the bottom, there are passages through it. This line has it all, except reliable snow, the top couple hundred feet are often bare. When the spring, upslope storms spin from the east and load this line up, take advantage of the window and go for it.

From the winter junction, skin up the road, to the base of the face. Take a moment along the way to study the face and line up the summit position. Then, once you know where you want to be, ascend and follow your boot track for the descent. Angles range from low to high 40s.
